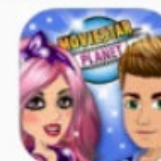

- Around ~~11000~~ 50,000 reports are received by CEOP during the summer
- Approx. 70% directly relate to online grooming
- Over 15 million children have seen Thinkuknow

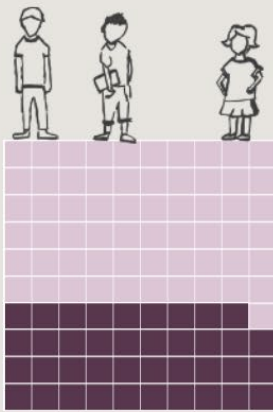

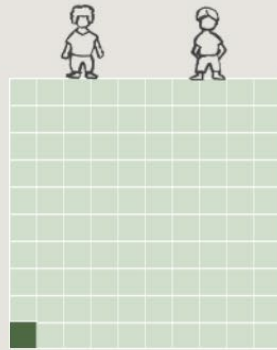

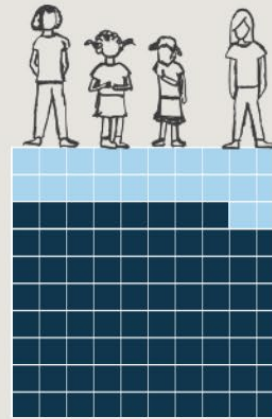

Trends in helpline advice contacts and referrals



There were 66,218 contacts made to the NSPCC helpline in 2016/17. The number of contacts increased in 2016/17 after a decrease in 2015/16; prior to this the helpline saw a five year increase in the number of contacts.

The increased demand reflects media attention in 2016/17, particularly around allegations of abuse in football.

Contacts to the helpline can result in the caller receiving advice or a referral being made to an external agency such as a local authority or the police

The proportion of contacts that led to a referral increased steadily since 2007/08. In 2016/17, 71.7 per cent of all contacts led to a referral.*

WANTED New social media law

We're calling for a new law to make social networks safer for children.

- **An independent regulator**

We demand an independent regulator is created who can put in place mandatory child safety rules for social networks and has the power to fine them if they don't make their networks safe.

- **Safe accounts for children**

We demand social networks offer safe accounts for children and proactively search for, and stop, child grooming on their platforms. Social networks must make it easier for users to report concerns about child safety and provide a dedicated fast-track process for reporting.

- **Detailed reporting on how they're keeping children safe**

We demand children and parents are told how safe the networks are. Social networks must publish details of how they're keeping children safe and how they deal with reports and complaints.

- Voicemails- 8-11's average 10 calls per week. 12-15's average 21 calls per week
- **Texting**
- 8-11's – 54 messages per week (ave.).
- 12-15's – 255 messages per week (ave.)

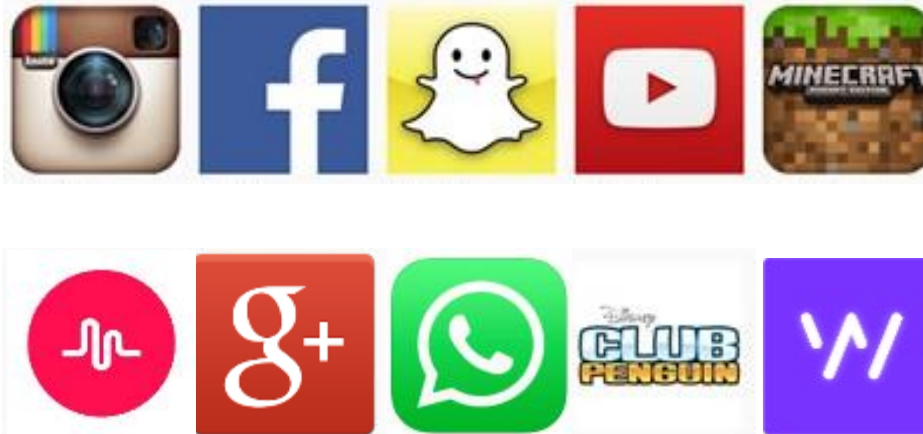

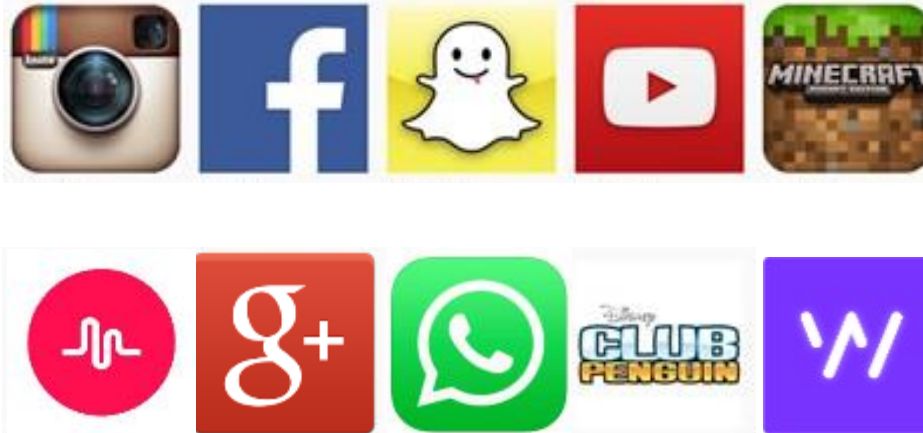

Breck Bednar, 14, was fatally stabbed by 19-year-old Lewis Daynes

A 19-year-old man has been jailed for life for the murder of a 14-year-old boy he met online. Described by investigators as "quite unique in terms of how horrific it was", the case involved the manipulation of a schoolboy who was turned against his family and ultimately lured to his death.

- Helping the children to understand how easy it is for things to get out of control online – **Breck foundation**



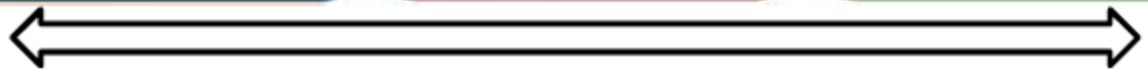
Create boundaries and rules for the amount of time child can spend online. It's never too early to start putting limits in place.

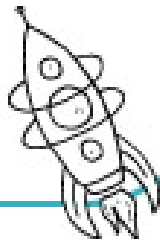

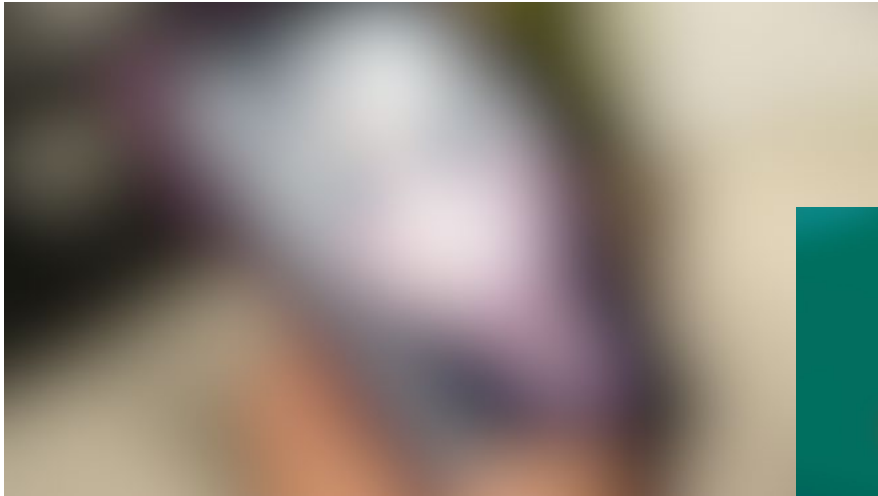

National Crime Agency...has warned Fortnite is putting children at risk from online paedophiles due to the chat facility. Although the game itself seems pretty harmless, players can talk and type whatever they want to each other, and bad language is rampant.

March 2018, a mother from Merseyside told how she intervened when her 12-year-old son was offered £50 to perform "sex acts" while playing the game by a man grooming him online.

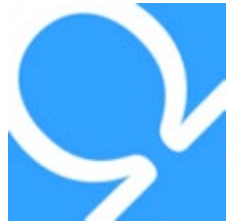
- Children hooked on addictive video games like Fortnite will be able to seek treatment on the NHS, after video gaming is classified as a medical disorder by the World Health Organisation (WHO). The move comes amid increasing evidence of young players suffering psychological distress and family breakdown as a result of their addiction.



Inappropriate Apps – routine



Whisper - Many children are drawn to communicating with strangers, feeling that their secrets are safer with them than with their friends



ChatRoulette and Omegle— These apps allow you to video chat with strangers.



Poof – Hides other apps on your phone. You select which apps you would like to hide and their icons will no longer show up on your smartphone screen.



Huggle Huggle allows you to discover and connect with others who frequent the same places as you and start chatting...

Current laws on content/sharing

- By creating, sending or possessing indecent pictures of a person under 18 is **breaking the law**

(Protection of Children Act 1978 / Criminal Justice Act 1988)

** However.. The police are not out to prosecute. A child needs to be 10 years of age in order to be prosecuted.*

What can we do

- Talking to each other – opening lines of communication
- Keeping up to date with technology is a must
- Setting up parental controls
- Being active with your child's computer/technology use
- Checking their activity
- Reviewing any online games
- If they social network check their accounts/share them



Privacy/digital footprint

- The information we put online leaves 'footprints'
- Young people can easily identified or traced
- Once information is online it is hard to remove – it can be copied, cached etc and may be around forever
- Information about individuals is not just stored on their profiles – friends, family contacts....
